## Marriage Honored by All

Sarah is a single girl who lived through the divorce of her parents, yet when she talks about getting married, she anticipates a more godly relationship than what she saw growing up. She is excited for her married future! Corrine is a widow, and she talks often about how wonderful her husband was and how she is so glad that she was married to that one man for 52 years.

Jon, Sarah, and Corrine can appreciate a joke about marriage. They'll laugh if someone says something like, "Marriage is nature's way of keeping people from fighting with strangers." They all know that married people have disagreements... often. But they all refuse to characterize marriage as a "fighting relationship."

That's a married man, a widowed lady, and a single girl obeying the command of the Lord: "Marriage is to be honored by all..." (Hebrew 13:4). The passage isn't just one for married people. Marriage is to be honored by all!

Honoring marriage begins in our minds (how we determine to think about marriage), that leads our hearts (so that we feel positively about marriage), that leads to uplifting talk (what we say about marriage).

Some important steps to hold marriage in high regard are:

1. Fill your mind with what God has said about marriage and marital love (Ephesians 5:21-33; Song of Solomon).
2. Determine to conform your will to obey the Lord's will about marriage (1 Cor 7:1-5)
3. Speak up about godly marriages.
4. Be diligent to change the perception that individual Christians and the Church should mind their own business when it comes to marriage.
5. Model a godly marriage.
6. Hold others accountable.
7. Bear each other's burdens (Galatians 6:1-2)

The Chevrolet Company did something revolutionary by unveiling their 1953 Corvette. It was exciting, fresh, and new but unfortunately they didn't commit to improving every year. The '52-'55 Corvettes didn't change much and so sales declined as a result. People were less impressed, but more importantly less interested. Something had to be done; cars were sitting on sales lots collecting dust. It was the 1956 Corvette that really established the two-seater as a legitimate performance machine. Improvements were made at every level starting with a brand new body sporting chromed grille, scalloped flanks, removable hard top, and nice, new, rounded trunk. The heart of the changes came in the form of a new 265-cubic-inch V8 with a beefy three-speed manual transmission perfect for racing (which is what the Corvette was truly made for). Not only did it look the part, it could back it up. From 1956 on, the Chevrolet Corporation kept improving on the design and function of the Corvette.

As Christians we can do the same. We may have had some times when we feel like life

is stagnant and is not working in our lives. When we make the improvements and make a commitment to grow, Christ not only gives us a new look, he gives us a beefy engine to back up the smoother exterior. Make the decision to keep growing and making improvements to your relationship with Christ. # Perry's Scope

## Three Categories

Over the years I have observed that congregations are divided into three basic categories. This is not necessarily an equal division, but the members tend to fall into one of three areas within the church.

The first category, the "Proactive," is composed of the members who want to "go." Their motto is "Do Something!" They take the commands of Christ seriously and want to impact the world in a meaningful way. Sometimes zeal in this group can bounce them to the extreme of, "Do something, even if it is wrong!" However, when focused within the boundaries of scripture, this group moves the church forward.


The second category is the "Reactive." Their motto is, "I Shall Not Be Moved." This group tends to react to new ideas as potentially threatening. They hold back and refuse to make changes. They may even hold the traditions of men on a par with scripture.

The third category is the "Inactive." Their motto is "Whatever!?" This group is not concerned about the church's direction, the church's traditions, or even in some cases, the scriptures. Church is merely a convenience. As long as it does not interfere with their lives, they will attend. Service is a low priority.

We tend to move between the categories, depending on our circumstances. Where are you right now? Are you pushing forward? Are you holding back? Do you not really care? If the church depended on you, what would she get?
