It's not "Reality Augmentation." It's lying!

Janet hated it when Greg forgot to give her the ATM receipts. She was responsible for keeping their books, and she was great at it. She got really upset with him when he messed her up, and she let him know it! That's why she was so embarrassed when she forgot to pay the electric bill. He picked up the mail when he came home for lunch and found the threatening cut-off notice. When he asked her about the bill, she knew immediately that she had forgotten to pay it, but that isn't what she told him. She told him that she had paid it, and that she would find out what had happened. He trusted her, so he didn't pursue what she had learned from the utility. She paid the bill online, with the late fee, and told him later, "They fixed the problem." She never told him what really happened.

If you really do work it out, no real harm is done that you can see; can't you call it "reality augmentation" instead of a lie? Of course you can. You can call it anything you want, but it is still a lie!

"Therefore each of you must put off falsehood and speak truthfully to his neighbor, for we are all members of one body" (Ephesians 4:25).

Don't lie. Tell the truth. That's what we do in this relationship.

If you lie to "protect" someone's feelings; it's still a lie.

If you lie to stay out of trouble; it's still a lie.

If you intentionally leave a false impression; it's a lie.

"Speak truthfully" to your neighbors. Who is your neighbor? Anyone who needs to hear the truth from you. Your spouse, your children, your friends, your brothers and sisters in Christ, your parents, your co-workers, your enemies, and your next door neighbors all need you to tell the truth.

Paul told the Colossians, *"Do not lie to each other, since you have taken off your old self with its practices and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge in the image of its Creator" (Colossians 3:9-10).*

Tell the truth. That's the way of the New Person in Christ. That's the way of the person trying to be like God.

Five Steps of Salvation

At one point during the early days of the American Restoration Movement, the whole effort almost came to an end. Momentum for the concept of the unity of believers virtually stopped. Had it not been for Walter Scott, the Movement would have died.

Scott, as other preachers of the day, held "protracted meetings" (or Gospel Meetings). He would go to schoolyards and tell the children about the "Five Steps of Salvation" using the fingers on his hand. Then he sent them home to tell their parents. As a result of this simple memory technique, many people changed from their previous denominational allegiances to unite as "Christians only."

Scott's five steps were:

1. Faith
2. Repentance
3. Baptism
4. Remission of Sins
5. Holy Spirit & Eternal Life

Over Time, these steps have changed to:

1. Hear (Rom. 10:14-17)
 2. Believe (Mark 16:16)
 3. Repent (Acts 2:38)
 4. Confess (Matt. 10:32-33)
 5. Be Baptized (Mark 16:16; Acts 2:38; I Peter 3:21)
- And some like to add . . .
6. Live faithfully until death

One way to look at the steps is to see them as our efforts to earn or gain salvation and appease an angry God. Another way is to see the steps as the process by which God saves us and creates a loving relationship with us through Jesus. One puts the emphasis on US, the other on God.
